

Driving Directions from Cruz Bay on St. John, to Luna Vista

The first thing when driving in the Virgin Islands is: **‘Don’t forget to Keep Left’**. Your rental car company should be able to give you a map, but at least they should be able to direct you to Dolphin Market. At the most confusing intersection on St John next to that market there is a construction project. They are building a new roundabout where the old Texaco station used to be. They have taken part of that down to build the roundabout. What you need to do is keep to the left around the new roundabout and go clockwise around it. Exit onto Hwy 10 up the hill and have the old Texaco station on your right hand side and Dolphin Market on your left. You will not turn off this road until our driveway 5 ½ miles distant.

There are 159 curves between Cruz Bay and Coral Bay so it is quite winding and slow. We are located just beyond the restaurant Chateau Bordeaux (about 5 miles) on Centerline Road (Hwy 10) going toward Coral Bay. This is the first sign of civilization you will see after you pass through the outskirts of Cruz bay and go through the National Park land. The restaurant, tourist shops, 'Colorful Corner' on the left, 'TuTu Much' on the right and an overlook to Coral Bay and the East are quite obvious. There is a newly painted purple wall at ‘Colorful Corner’ on the left which you can’t miss.

You are nearly there. We are just beyond mile post 5.5 on the left side of the road about 1/4 mile past the overlook area. Just after you round the sharp curve to the left immediately after the 5.5 milepost sign there is a private sign "Notre Ciel" on the left. At that sign, turn left up the dirt road. Our driveway is about 300' up the dirt road. It is the first left after it turns to concrete.

The secret to turning into our driveway, as it is a very sharp turn to the left, is not to cut it sharp, make a wide turn. Go up the hill a little before turning to the left on the level area. Aim between the two traveler trees, stop at the wall, back up, then turn in toward the gate. The gate is to keep the donkeys and goats from eating our landscaping. The gate is electric and has a push button on the left hand side. If it is closed, push the ‘door bell’ button attached to a tall skinny tree to open it. It will close automatically behind you as you drive in. Once you have done this maneuver once, it will be easy. If you have any questions, please call or e-mail.
