Driving Directions from Cruz Bay to Luna Vista

The first thing is, 'Don't forget to Keep Left'. Your rental car company should be able to give you a map, but at the least they should be able to direct you to the new roundabout. They have now completed the new roundabout at the intersection where the old Texaco gas station used to be. Be sure to yield to traffic in the roundabout. Enter the roundabout to the left, then in a clockwise direction around it. Exit left onto Route 10 East up the hill and have the Dolphin Market on your left. The thing we like about roundabouts is if you are unsure of which exit to take, you can just go round and around until you are sure of the one to take. You will not turn off Hwy 10 until our driveway 5 ½ miles distant.

There are 159 curves between Cruz Bay and Coral Bay so it is quite winding and slow. We are located just beyond the restaurant Chateau Bordeaux (about 5 miles) on Centerline Road (Hwy 10) going toward Coral Bay. This is the first sign of civilization you will see after you pass through the outskirts of Cruz bay and go through the National Park land. The restaurant, tourist shops, 'Colorful Corner' on the left, 'TuTu Much' on the right and an overlook to Coral Bay and the East are quite obvious. There is a newly painted purple wall at 'Colorful Corner' on the left which you can't miss.

You are nearly there. We are just beyond mile post 5.5 on the left side of the road about 1/4 mile past the overlook area. Just after you round the sharp curve to the left immediately after the 5.5 milepost sign there is a private sign "Notre Ciel" on the left. At that sign, turn left up the dirt road. Our driveway is about 300' up the dirt road. It is the first left after it turns to concrete.

The secret to turning into our driveway, as it is a very sharp turn to the left, is **not to cut it sharp**, make a wide turn. Go up the hill a little before turning to the left on the level area. Aim between the two traveler trees, stop at the wall, back up, then turn in toward the gate. The gate is to keep the donkeys and goats from eating our landscaping. The gate is electric and has a push button on the left hand side. If it is closed, push the 'door bell' button attached to a tall skinny tree to open it. It will swing in and will close automatically behind you as you drive in. Once you have done this maneuver once, it will be easy. If you have any questions, please call or e-mail.
